Christina Ashby

Christina Ashby graduated from the University of Alaska Anchorage's Theater and Dance Department in 2009. While at UAA, Christina was the president of the student theater club, Theatre on the Rocks, for two consecutive years. Through the club, she was able to direct her first show, *Fat Pig* by Neil LaBute. Christina also had the great opportunity to update *The Trojan Women* as *The Women of...* as part of her honors thesis project. After graduation, Christina directed a critically and audience acclaimed production of Bert V. Royal's *Dog Sees God* at Out North. Christina also directed for Alaska Theater of Youth and taught improv for TBA Theatre, two youth institutions she grew up attending. In the summer of 2010, along with a group of friends, Christina co-created a live sketch comedy show, *The Pogo Stick Gogo Dancer Company*, that played to sold out audiences throughout the month of July. In 2011, Christina moved to Chicago where she studied at the acclaimed Act One Studios. There she completed a year long

After earning his master's degree from Wichita State University, he served as the Director of Wichita Children's Theater's Center Stage program. He is the author of over a dozen plays that are produced nationally and internationally. His collaborative work, Soapy Smith's Alaskan Extravaganza, first won international acclaim as the American representative to the Olympic Arts Festival at the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney, Australia. In the summer of 2015 the same script was awarded the Slap Stick Award for Physical Comedy at the Fringe Festival in Edinburgh, Scotland. He appears frequently in film and television where his credits include Big Miracle, Moose the Movie, Baby Geniuses 3, and appearances on the Discover Channel and Animal Planet. He is currently part of the staff of the Wendy Williamson Auditorium at UAA.

and many other companies. His play The Resurrection Of Humpty Dumpty played off Broadway as part of the Samuel French Short Play Festival and four of his plays have been performed at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe to great acclaim. He has been honored with two Patricia Neil Acting Awards, The Harper Service Award, the UAA Alumnus of Distinction, and was named by the readers of the Anchorage Press as Anchorage's Best Actor in 2015. Shane currently serves as the manager for the Wendy Williamson Auditorium here at UAA.

Erin Dagon Mitchell

Erin is a founding member of TBA Theatre and currently serves as its associate artistic director. She is one of Alaska's most celebrated directors having helmed critically acclaimed productions for nearly every theatre company in town, including Cyrano's, the Anchorage Concert Chorus, Anchorage Community Theater, UAA, and TBA Theatre. Three times the host of KSKA's Stage

Talk have named her as Anchorage's Top Director. She earned her master's degree from Wichita State University where her emphasis was in directing and scenic painting. Currently she is the director of the theater program at South Anchorage High School where she has twice taken productions to the prestigious American High School Theater Festival as part of the Fringe Festival in Edinburgh, Scotland. This past year her production was named the Outstanding Production by the AHSTF.

Dawson Moore graduated with his B.A. in Theatre and Dance in 1997. After a year spent exploring the film industry in LA (where he worked for Skylark Films as a story analyst), he moved to San Francisco.

he worked for Eureka Theatre as their Literary Manager, served on the Board of the Playwrights Center of San Francisco, and helped start two theatre companies, the Unidentified Theatre Company and Three Wise Monkeys. The latter focused on staging new work by Bay Area writers, and created and produced the annual Bay One-Acts Festival, which involved bringing 8-12 companies from the Bay Area together to produce new scripts; the program continued until 2013, producing and publishing over 120 plays. Moore attended the Last Frontier Theatre Conference as a playwright and actor since its third year, 1995, and was brought on board as its Coordinator in 2003. He now lives in Valdez, where he works for Prince William Sound College. Moore began writing plays while at UAA Theatre, and has since had over 100 productions of his work across the country, in addition to

international productions in Italy and Namibia. He has won national awards for his short comedies Bile in the Afterlife, In a Red Sea, The Peach, The Bus, Burning, The Fears of Harold Shivvers, and Domestic Companion. Six Dead Bodies Duct-Taped to Merry-Go-Round, co-written with Lindsay Mariana Walker, is published in Applause Books Best American Short Plays 2010-2011, and was turned into a short film by Kevin Bennett, who is currently seeking financing to produce a feature film version; The War of Virginia and Alabama is available from JAC Publications; and he served as the editor for Monologues from The Last Frontier Theatre Conference, which also included his work. His other produced plays include LibidOFF; Happy Loving Couples are a Thing of the Past; Secret Stuffing; Alyson and the Great Bagel Mistake; The Fears of Harold Shivvers; Living with the Savage; Oh, Nancy!; Laundry Day; Love's Lumberings Remembered; Skid Marks; and The Tie.

Harold Phillips

Harold Phillips began his college career in 1989 at UAA. He continued his studies at Western Washington University and finally received his B.A. in Drama from the University of Portland. Since college he has lived and worked in Portland, Ore. where he's performed at a variety of theatres including the Miracle Theatre Co., Northwest Children's Theatre, Mt. Hood Repertory Theatre Company (where he also served as Operations Director.) Tygre's Heart Shakespeare Company, Classic Greek Theater of Oregon, and Artists Repertory Theatre.

In the early 2000s Harold shifted his focus to work in front of the camera, appearing in independent films such as Sum of the Parts, Dark Horizon, The Bicyclists, Crackin' The Code and The Falls series (The Falls and The Falls: Testament of Love.) He also began working in the nascent field of internet video and gained worldwide attention in the interactive movie The Outbreak and pioneering web series such as Lady Wasteland and Animus Cross. Roles in television shows such as TNT's Leverage and NBC's Grimm followed soon thereafter.

A firm believer that "a rising tide lifts all boats," Harold has worked hard over the years to grow and strengthen theatre and media production in the Pacific Northwest. He and his wife Trish Egan have served as co-presidents of the Portland Area Theatre Alliance, and Harold founded and maintains two listservs dedicated to supporting Portland-area theatre – PDXOnstage and PDXBackstage. He is a founding member of the Alliance of Professional Performers – NW, and as a member of the Oregon Media Production Association Harold has worked hard to increase the professionalism of Oregon's film and TV industry while lobbying the state's legislature in support of that industry. This work has been recognized multiple times over the years, with awards including the "Unsung Hero" Drammy award in 2009, the OMPA's "Superfine Actor" award in 2011 and the Oregon Actors Awards "Megann Ratzow Above and Beyond" award in 2014.

Harold continues to live and work in Portland and to promote the strengths of the city's artistic and media production community.
